2021 Survey Overview

2021 Survey Methodology

Distribution method: Online survey emailed to app users who activated a ticket within the last 60 days & advertised onboard with QR code. Generally, between 60-75% of all riders purchase their tickets in the app. Paper ticket users had the option to complete the survey using an on-board QR code, but only if they also owned a smartphone. An estimated 85% of Americans [own a smartphone](#). Respondents were asked to fill out according to their most recent trip; most respondents (99%) responded to the email, meaning QR code respondents and non-app users were under-represented.

Language: Survey was available in English, Spanish, Chinese, Korean, Polish, Russian, and Yiddish. 43 surveys were completed in a language other than English.

Data Collection: Survey was open for 13 days: Saturday, Oct. 2 – Friday, Oct. 15

7 Routes: 

Responses collected: ~4,100 (average of 215 per route/time period bin), weighted based on actual observed ridership

Purpose: Customer segmentation & demographic information; trip purpose and NYC Ferry usage patterns; COVID-19 recovery

COVID Recovery and NYC Ferry

COVID-19's impacts on NYCF in 2020 were clear. While 0% of the city was vaccinated and many were working from home, survey response rate, ridership, and trip frequency diverted greatly from years prior. In 2021, rising vaccination rates have been followed by the emergence of new variants and continued COVID-19 transmission, delaying COVID recovery at the workplace and continuing to alter travel patterns. Even still, NYC Ferry has had the highest rate of return of any transit option in NYC, with return rate consistently over 80% since September.

Return to Office: The Partnership for New York City's October 2021 employer survey found that [28% of Manhattan office workers are on-site](#) during an average workday. Also, the metropolitan area's [unemployment rate has fallen since 2020](#), signaling a recovering job market in many economic sectors.

School Begins In-Person: NYC Public schools started September 13th without a remote learning option.

Service Area Growth: The St. George Ferry route launched in August 2021, adding 3 landings and expanding service to all 5 boroughs. NYC Ferry's service area is defined as all US Census Tracts within a 0.5 mile radius of a landing.

Survey Weighting

Beginning with the 2019 summer survey, NYC Ferry survey results have been weighted based on actual observed ridership during the survey period. This is done to ensure that totals and percentages are more reflective of actual demographics and ridership, rather than survey response rate.

1. Survey data is collected and prepped for analysis
2. Responses are categorized by both route and time of day. Time period categories are below:
 - AM Peak (Weekdays before 10AM)
 - PM Peak (Weekdays between 4PM & 7PM)
 - Off Peak (Weekdays between 10AM & 4PM, Weekdays after 7PM)
 - Weekend (All times on Saturday/Sunday)
3. Actual ridership during the survey period is separated into the same route/time period buckets as the survey results
4. The weighted value is then found using the following formula for each route/time period bucket:
 - $(\text{Total Survey Responses in Bucket}) / (\text{Total Observed Ridership in Bucket})$
 - This weighted value is used so that when survey responses are summed, they are equal to the actual ridership on that route/time period

Summary of Results

The results of the 2021 survey remained consistent with previous surveys in some ways, but trip purpose and frequency continue to be impacted by COVID-19 and slower than anticipated return to office rates among workers.

Consistent with Previous Results

- Ridership 32% non-white or multiracial
- A majority (79%) of riders walked or biked to and from the ferry landing
- 88% of riders are NYC residents, increasing to 91% in AM and PM Peaks

Changes from Previous Surveys

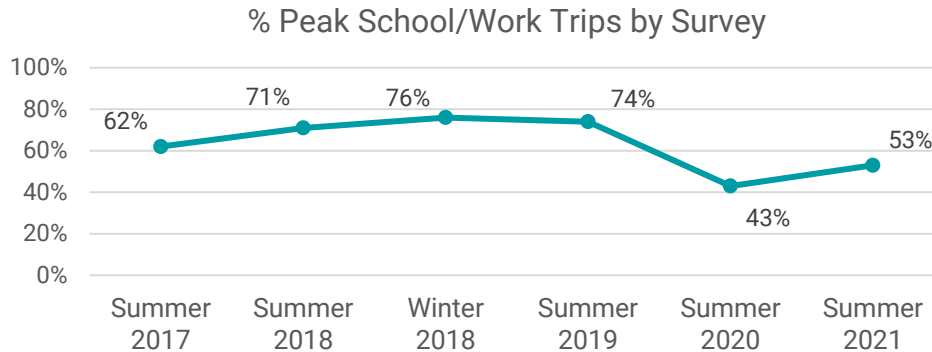
- 53% of peak riders are using the service to commute to work or school, rising since 2020 but still below pre-pandemic levels
- 58% of riders have returned to work in-person at least once a week
- 38% of riders ride the ferry 4 or more times a week, rising since 2020 but still below pre-pandemic levels
- Systemwide Median Income increased to \$100,000-\$149,999


2021 Survey – Trip Patterns

Trip purpose by route and time period

53% of peak period riders are commuting to work or school. During all time periods, 25% of riders are commuting to work or school.

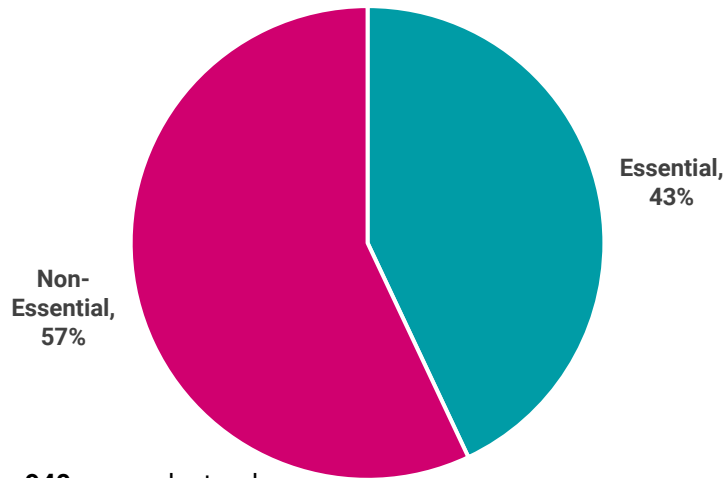

 This is **lower** than NYCF surveys pre-COVID, but higher than the Summer 2020 survey, indicating that while COVID's impact on commuting patterns lingers, riders are returning to work and school in-person.

Essential Work and Return to Office

24% of riders used NYCF to commute to the office/worksite. Of these riders, 43% identified as essential workers. Essential commuters accounted for 10% of total ridership.

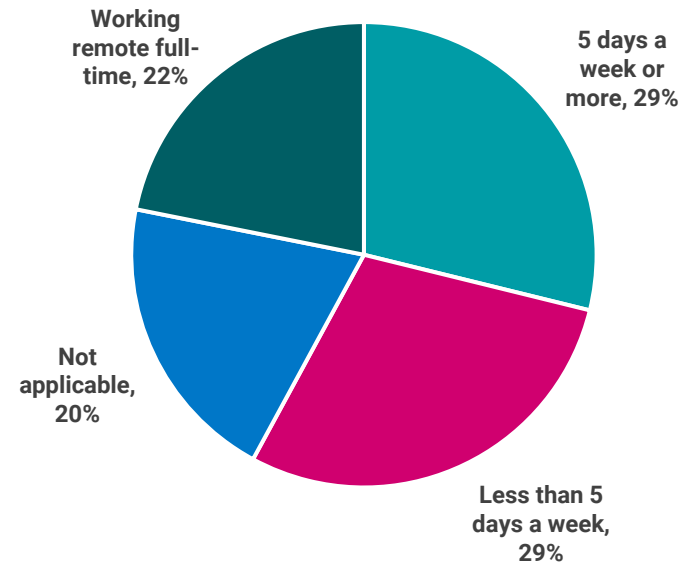
58% of riders indicated they have returned to the office/worksite at least once a week.

% All Riders Returning to the Office

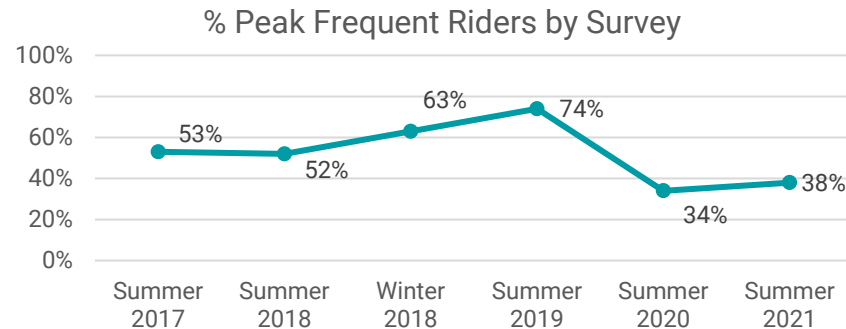

Trip frequency

38% of peak riders use the ferry on a regular basis.

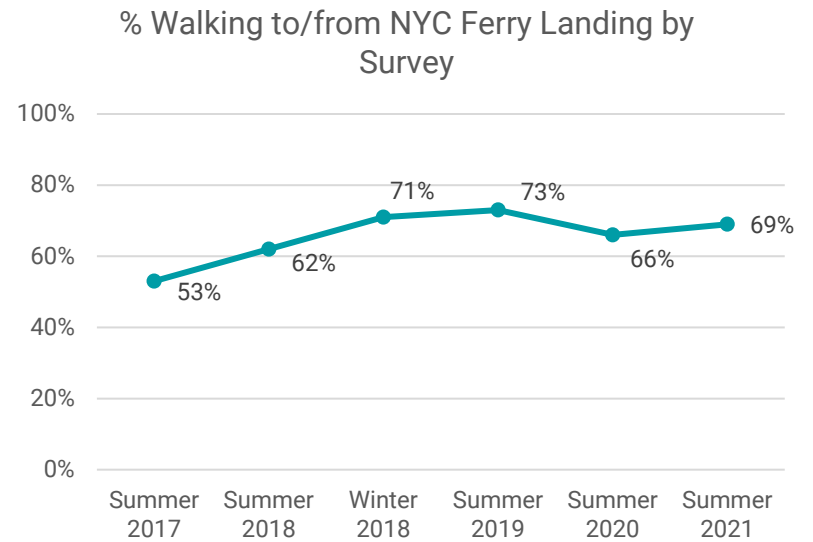
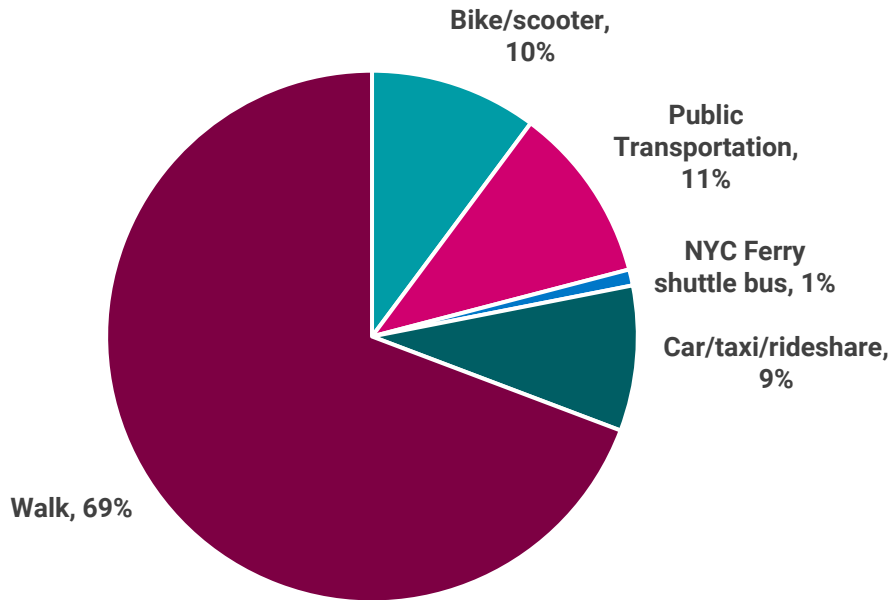

Peak rider frequency was **lower** than pre-pandemic, indicative of changes in travel behavior and work-from-home trends during the pandemic, as well as subsequent recovery.

Mode to/from landings

69% of riders walk to or from the ferry. 11% use other public transportation services. 9% use an automobile to access the landings. Rockaway, St. George, and Soundview account for most drivers. Public transit use is highest at East 34th Street and Wall Street/Pier 11.

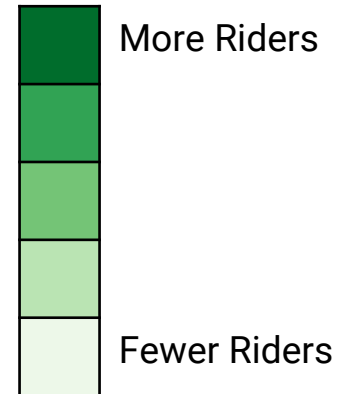
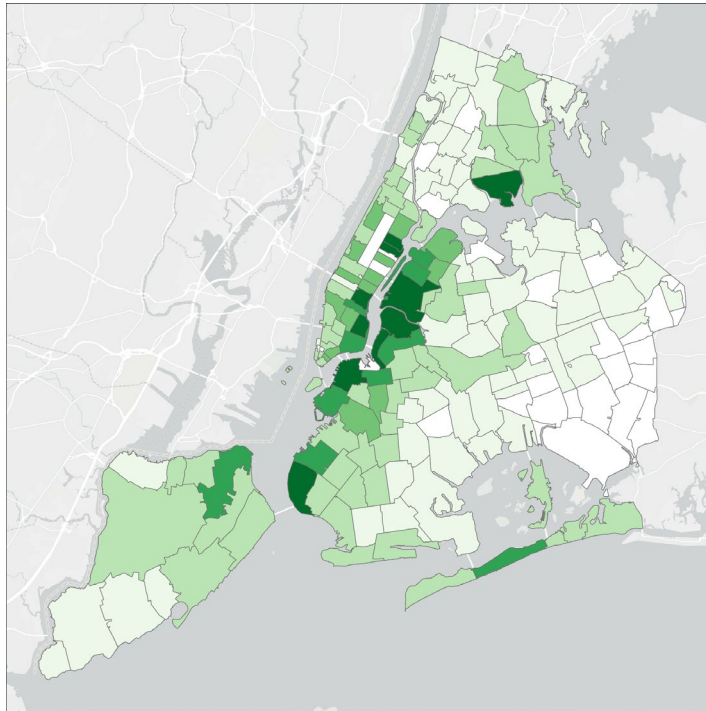


The share of MTA bus/subway and car/taxi/rideshare access is **up** from previous surveys. Bike/scooter access is down.

2021 Survey – Demographic Data

All routes – home ZIP codes

88% of riders reside within New York City. 91% of peak riders live in New York. This year, more Staten Islanders completed the survey due to the **St. George** route launch.



There were **3,931** respondents with valid ZIP codes entered.



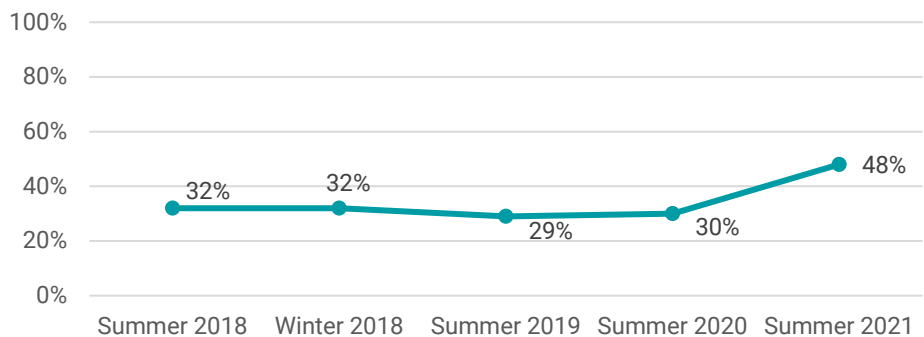
The percentage of riders who live in New York is **lower** than in 2020 (95% of ridership), but reflective of the rise in tourism as travel restrictions have been lifted and vaccination rates rise during this recovery period.

Age

The percentage of riders over 45 years-of-age has increased since 2020.

% Riders Over 45 by Survey

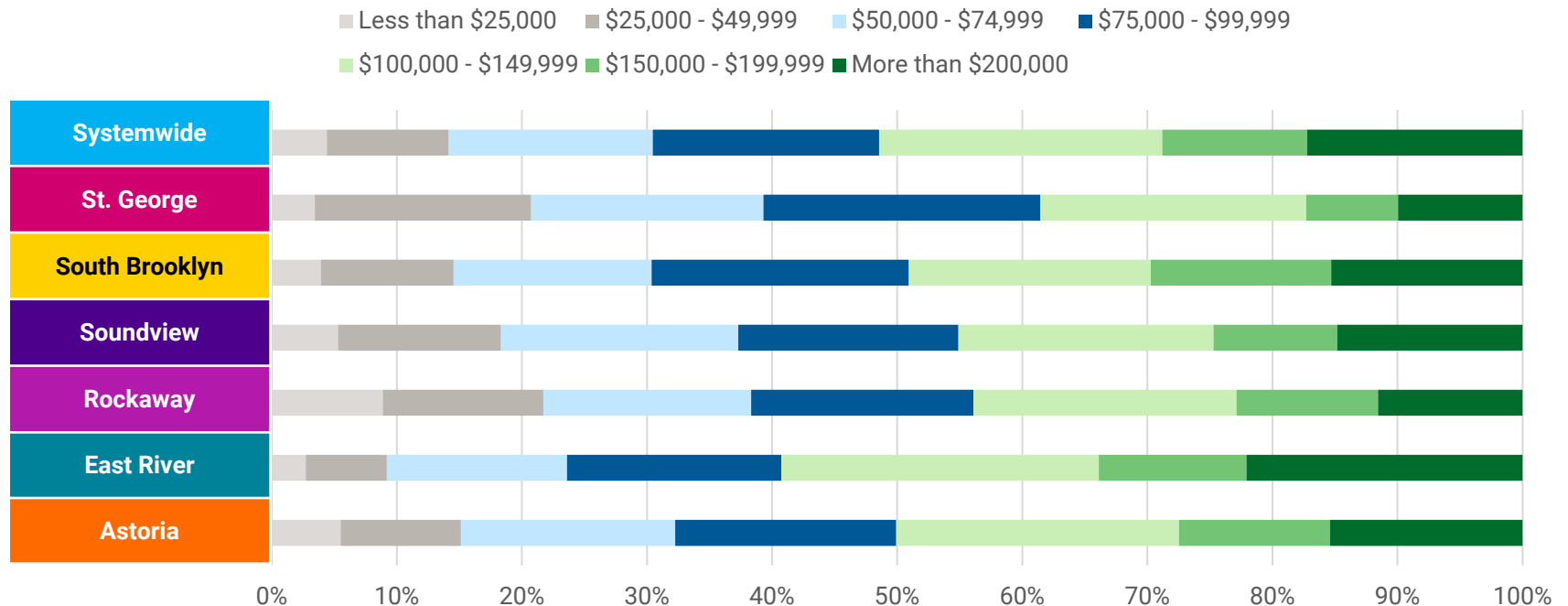


While other surveys saw a consistent response to question of age, this year's survey had the highest rate of response for riders identifying as over 45 than any previous survey

Income

The systemwide median income is \$100,00-149,999, an increase from 2019 and 2020 but in line with 2017 and 2018. **East River** route, NYC Ferry's highest ridership route, had the highest percentage of riders with incomes greater than \$100,000. 4 out of 6 routes had median incomes of \$75,000-\$99,999. Per the US Census Bureau, the East River service area has an annual median Income of [\\$118,072](#). The median household income for all routes is [\\$95,171](#).



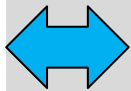
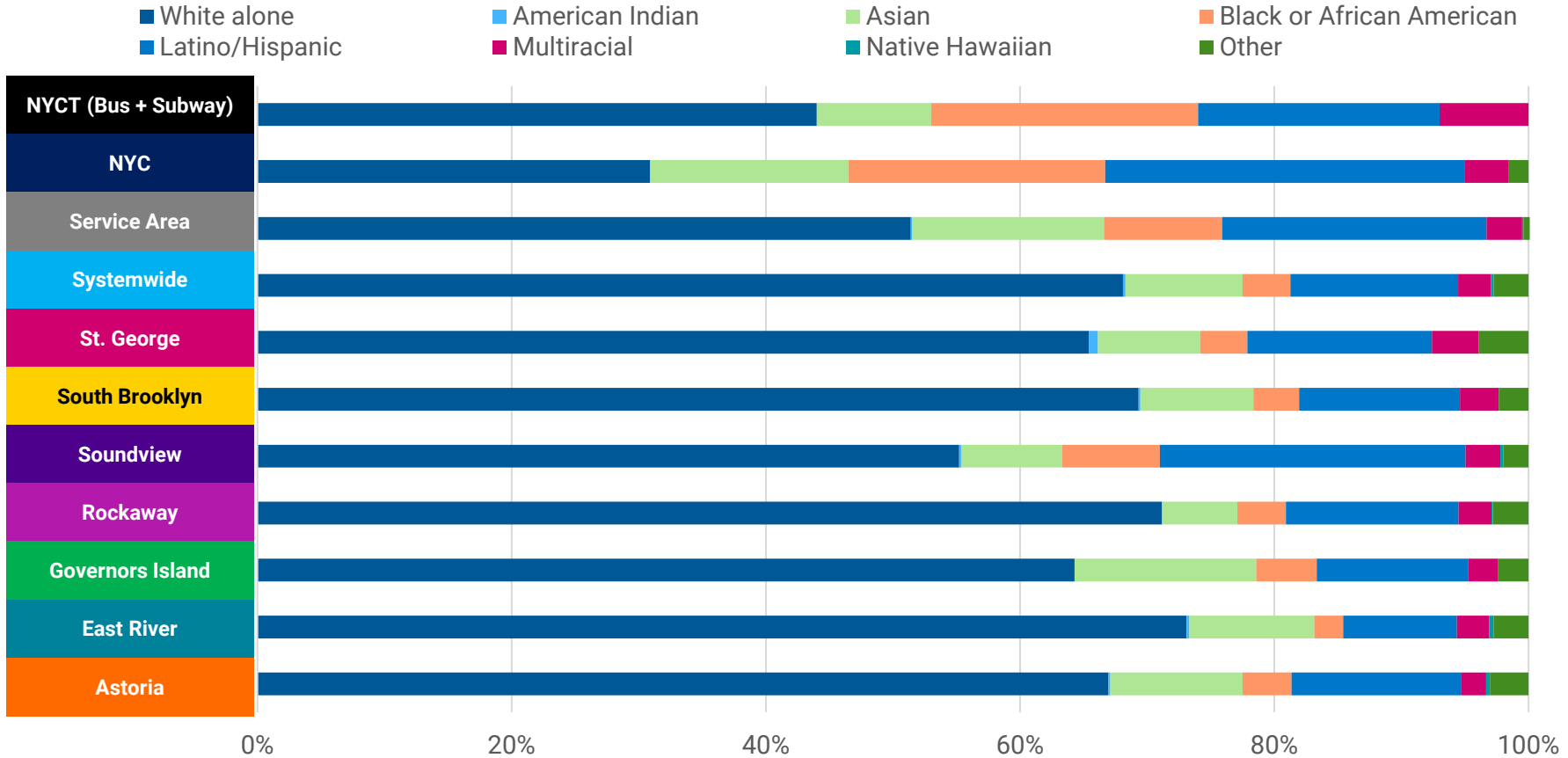
The annual income has **increased** since 2019 and 2020.

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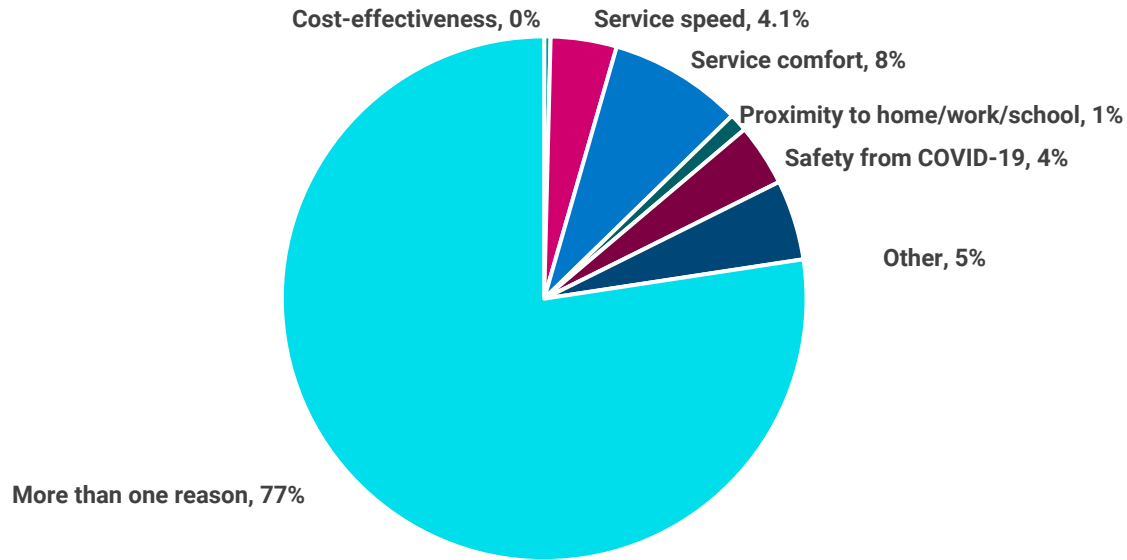
